of new car owners hitting the roadways each year. This increased demand adds upward pressure to the price of oil. Now, let's consider the price of gasThe price of oil determines much of the price of gasoline and diesel fuel. Our capacity to convert that oil into gasoline and diesel fuel by refineries is equally as important. Unfortunately, US refineries are in crisis. The number of refineries throughout the nation has substantially decreased over the last two decades, and the infrastructure of the remaining refineries is in abysmal condition. Even though American oil companies receive over six billion dollars a year in government subsidies, they
are reluctant to enter into the process are reluctant to enter into the process of building new refineries because of the roadblocks thrown up by the green people, especially those who are con-
cerned about adverse effects on the envicerned about adverse effects on the envi-
ronment - particularly their little patch of the environment. It is therefore patch of impossible to build new refineries.

This reduced refining capacity creates artificial bottlenecks in the supply of fuel products. Thus, the artificially limited supply of fuel puts upward pressure on the price of gasoline and diesel fuel.
Further exacerbating the situation, refinFurther exacerbating the situation, refineries schedule maintenance shutdowns
during the spring and summer months, during the spring and summer months,
reducing the supply of fuel during peak reducing the supply of fuel during peak
driving time. Most of the resulting price driving time. Most of the resulting price
increases go directly to the bottom lines increases go directly to the bottom lines bandits. bandits.

We pay the oil companies billions artificially inflate the price of gasoline and diesel fuel, resulting in huge profits. Of course, the oil company executives explain that the "awl bidness" is much too complicated for the American consumer to understand. Adding insult to injury, oil lobbyists have convinced our representatives, who are apt to listen to folks who give them millions of dollars that these oil subsidies and obscene prof its are vital to our energy independence, which of course, is a crock.

Neither the president nor the congress can control the near term price of gasoline and diesel fuel. Laws of supply and demand determine the price, and oil speculators and the oil companies manipulate the supply. They are the primary culprits. Regardless of how much we drill we will not see a large decline in the price of gasoline and diesel fuel until we increase our refining capacity. Aspirin Tested as Cancer Treatment
Past research has shown that daily aspirin use has been associated with arresting the growth of certain cancers
According to a recent report in the journal ASC Medicinal According to a recent report in the journal ASC Medicinin called NOSH aspirin has been shown to be more effective in controlling the growth of several types of cancer. The report explains that NOSH aspirin gets its name from two compounds that are released from it. The compounds are nitric oxide (NO) and hydrogen sulfide (H2S). Researchers at the City University of New York Medical School, who developed NOSH and were associated with the report, indicate that these two compounds relax blood vessels and reduce inflammation. According to the report, in some instances, this specially formulated type of aspirin was more han 100,000 times more effective in stopping cancer growth than regular aspirin alone, and it did not cause damage to ormal cells.
