



NOTICE OF A PUBLIC HEARING ON THE ADOPTION OF THE DONLEY COUNTY MULTI-JURISDIC-TIONAL HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN

The Donley County Commissioners Court will conduct a public hearing before considering final adoption of the recently completed 2019 Donley County Hazard Mitigation Plan Update on Monday, January 14, 2019 at 9:00 a.m. in the Commissioners' Court Chambers of the Donley County Courthouse located at 300 S. Sully, Clarendon, Texas, This plan incorporates mitigation actions intended to minimize the impacts of certain natural hazards on the residents of the County.

The Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000, as amended, requires that local governments, develop, adopt, and update natural hazard mitigation plans in order to receive certain federal assistance. A Mitigation Action Team ("MAT") comprised of representatives from Donley County, the City of Clarendon, Hedley, Howardwick, Clarendon ISO and Hedley ISO, was convened to assess the risks from and vulnerabilities to natural hazards that are endemic to the Donley County area, and to make recommendations on mitigating the effects of such hazards. The original Hazard Mitigation plan was adopted in 2006 and in order to maintain its approved status by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), it has to be updated every five (5) years.
