unless the application is directly referred to a contested case hearing. OPPORTUNITY FOR A CONTESTED CASE HEAR-

ING You may request a contested case hearing. The applicant or the

executive director may also request that the application be directly referred to a contested case hearing after technical

review of the application. A contested case hearing is a legal proceeding similar to a civil trial in state district court. Unless

a written request for a contested case hearing is filed within 15 days from this notice, the executive director may act on the

application. If no hearing request is received within this 15 day period, no further opportunity for hearing will be

provided. According to the Texas Clean Air Act § 382.056(o) a contested case hearing may only be granted if the

applicant's compliance history is in the lowest classification under applicable compliance history requirements and if the

hearing request is based on disputed issues of fact that are relevant and material to the Commission's decision on the

application. Further, the Commission may only grant a hearing on those issues submitted during the public comment

period and not withdrawn. A person who may be affected by emissions of

who have standing to request a hearing must be identified by name and physical address. The interests the group or association

seeks to protect must also be identified. You may also submit your proposed adjustments to the

application/permit which would satisfy your concerns. Requests for a contested case hearing must be submitted

in writing within 15 days following this notice to the Office of the Chief Clerk at the address below.

If any requests for a contested case hearing are timely filed, the Executive Director will for ward the application and any requests for a contested case hearing to the

Commissioners for their consideration at a scheduled Commission meeting. Unless the application is directly referred to a

contested case hearing, the executive director will mail the response to comments along with notification of Commis-

sion meeting to everyone who submitted comments or is on the mailing list for this application. The Commission may only

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
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
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
