## Threat notice came two weeks later

A "Threat Announcement" sent out by Clarendon CISD caused a stir last Wednesday afternoon, February 13, as school officials attempted to rumors about a situation that had already been handled.

School officials and the Donley County Sheriff's Office both said there was no threat at the school despite a "Threat Announcement" sent out by phone, text, and email.

"There is no existing threat at the school," Sheriff Butch Blackburn said Wednesday evening. "It's been handled. The subject is not even in the state, and I verified that moments ago."

Superintendent Mike Norrell told the Enterprise that the school was made aware of a threat made on social media two weeks earlier and addressed the issue at that time. Norrell said an individual, for whom the school already had a no trespass order in place, came to the high school but was denied access and turned away.

Following that incident, the individual made a potentially threatening post on social media. The school alerted the Donley County Sheriff's Office about the possible threat and the issue was handled at that time.

Both Norrell and Blackburn say their offices take any threat very seriously and that the safety of students and staff is their primary concern.

Norrell said the school decided to send out the notice last week because there was recurring talk at the school and downtown that nothing had been done about the original situation.

## Double murder in H'wick Sheriff seeks clues to Monday night homicides

A double homicide in Howardwick Monday night has local and state investigators busy looking for clues to a suspect today.

Donley County Sheriff Butch Blackburn said the bodies of Candace Racheal Garret, 33, and James Edward Fierro, 34, were discovered Monday night.

"It was most definitely a homicide," Blackburn said.

Law enforcement personnel discovered the bodies in the couple's residence at 113 Lakeview Lane after the sheriff's office received a call at 10:09 p.m.

Four children, who were home at the time, were being interviewed

by The Bridge - Children's Advocacy Center on Tuesday.

Blackburn said Texas Rangers were called in to assist with the investigation. Both the victims had been shot, and the bodies were sent to Lubbock for autopsies.

As of press time Tuesday, the sheriff's office had no suspects and

no warrants had been issued in this case. Blackburn asks that if anyone has any information, please call the Donley County Sheriff's Office at 806-874-3533.

Also this week, an account has been set up at Herring Bank in Clarendon for the benefit of the couple's children.

## CCISD, Howardwick to hold May elections

Voters will get to choose who will serve on the Clarendon school board and the Howardwick City Council after candidates' sign-ups closed Friday, February 15.

Zack Robinson filed to run for the Clarendon CISD Board of Trustees and will face three incumbents on the ballot - Robin Ellis, Chuck Robertson, and Will Thompson. The top three candidates will be elected to that board.

In Howardwick, four people are running to succeed Mayor Greta Byars, who is not seeking re-election. Those candidates are Alderman Brice Hawley, Tony Clemishire, Coy Cooper, and Jeremy "J.D." Kindle. Also on the Howardwick ballot, five people are running for two positions on the city council. Alderman Johnny Floyd will be joined on the ballot by Beverly McCaskill, Erica Mills, Tammy

Jordan, and Jerry Mullanax.

Four other taxing entities did not have enough candidates file to have contested races.

In Clarendon, Mayor Mayor Sandy Skelton and Aldermen Nathan Floyd, Jacob Fangman, and Eulaine McIntosh filed for re-election.

Hedley Aldermen Tonya Metcalf and Alicia Hanes will be joined by Trisha Chambless on the city

council.

Hedley ISD trustees Michael Metcalf, Billy Hall, and Susan Cosby are unopposed.

The Donley County Hospital District Board of Directors has Jeff Robertson and Melinda McAnear returning, and they will be joined by Rose Lemley.

Elections for Clarendon CISD and the City of Howardwick will be held Saturday, May 4, 2019.

## City to start over on sign ordinance

Clarendon's sign ordinance will be completely redrafted following last Thursday's regular meeting of the city council.

City officials had been looking at Clarendon's sign regulations for about a year, focusing on "off premises" signs that are often used on a temporary basis.

A special committee appointed last year to suggest changes to the ordinances made its recommendations to limit the number and frequency of temporary "off premises" signs.

Jordan Green of the Whistle-Stop Trade Days commented on the proposed rule changes and requested more signs to be allowed and an increase in the number of times per year they can be used.

City Attorney Jim Shelton said the sign ordinance had already been amended several times and recommended that the city start over from scratch.

Aldermen took no official action but directed Shelton and City Hall to begin re-writing the sign

ordinance.

In other city business, the council approved a \$10,000 change order for the USDA-funded water infrastructure improvement project related to the painting of the new water standpipe.

Aldermen voted in favor of investing surplus funds leftover from the payoff of tax notes this month, a total of \$215,465.30, to be dedicated as General Fund Reserve.

A request for funds from the VFW Post to assist with building upkeep and improvements was denied.

Among items in his report, City Administrator David Dockery said the crack sealing at the airport was completed with a RAMP grant. The city is also approved for additional grant funds for fog sealing at the airport, but this item will be taken up by the airport board with the match for that grant having to come from other sources.

It was also announced that City Clerk Sharon Braddock will be retiring from the city on March 15.

Edge of the World chronicles a season in the life of Mitch Davis, portrayed by Trevor St. John (Roswell, New Mexico; Containment; Vampire Diaries; One Life to Live). Davis has a winning history as the Boys Ranch cross-country coach. Admired for his leadership with at-risk young men, he is well respected by his peers.

But, since a devastating personal loss, Davis has not been the same. As he leads a new team of

young athletes, Coach Davis must find the strength to heal and once again empower the youth who need him most.

In art, as in life, cross-country is a strong athletic tradition at Cal Farley’s Boys Ranch. The Roughriders began competing in the sport in 1981, and have legacy of strength, winning district championships every year since then. NOTICE OF RATE CHANGE REQUEST

Southwestern Electric Power Company (SWEPCO or Company) publishes this notice that on December 19, 2018, it filed its Statement of Intent and Application for Authority to Amend Transmission Cost Recovery Factor (TCRF) with the Public Utility Commission of Texas (PUCT or Commission) in Docket No. 49042. The filing was made in accordance with the Public Utility Regulatory Act (PURA) § 36.209 and 16 Tex. Admin. Code (TAC) § 25.239. The TCRF will recover SWEPCO’s reasonable and necessary costs for transmission infrastructure improvements as well as changes in wholesale transmission charges under a tariff approved by the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission (FERC) to the extent that the costs or charges have not otherwise been recovered. In this application, SWEPCO seeks to recover its transmission capital investments from July 1, 2016 through September 30, 2018. SWEPCO also seeks to recover through the TCRF approved transmission charges that are not otherwise being recovered through current rates.

This notice is being published in accordance with PURA § 36.103 and 16 TAC § 22.51(a)(1).

STATEMENT OF INTENT TO CHANGE RATES

SWEPCO requests that the Commission approve an increase of \$12,579,246 above the revenue requirement approved by the Commission in SWEPCO’s last base rate case, Docket No. 46449 (as reduced to reflect the reduction in federal corporate income taxes resulting from the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act of 2017). This amounts to a 3.58 percent increase in SWEPCO’s overall annualized Texas retail revenue requirement. SWEPCO proposes that its requested rate change become effective 35 days after the filing of the Statement of Intent and Application. The proposed effective date is subject to suspension and extension by actions that may be taken by the Commission.

All customers in SWEPCO’s Texas retail rate classes will be affected by this change. The impact of the rate change on various customer classes will vary from the overall impact described in this notice.
