baseball one of the most popular games in the world.

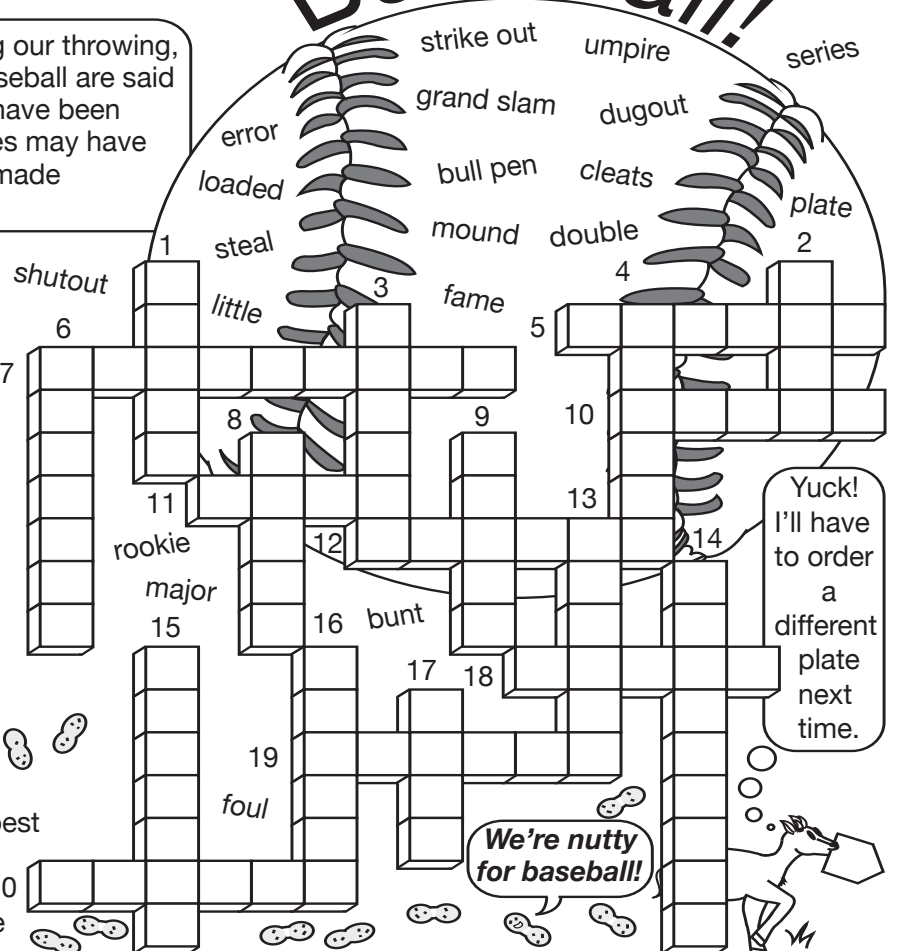
