## Clarendon CISD Grading Guidelines During COVID-19

## Philosophical Premises

- We understand this global pandemic has had overwhelming impacts on all of our families and we want to extend grace to students during this time of crisis.
- We understand that this shift to remote learning may have impacted the instructional integrity and the integrity of our grading system.
- We understand that students have varying levels of support and instructional resources at home.


## Elementary Grading Guidelines:

- $\quad 5^{\text {th }}$ six-weeks grades will be given as per normal teacher expectations and Clarendon Elementary grading policy.
- For completion of the $6^{\text {th }}$ six-weeks grading period, students will be given grades based upon the following scenarios:
- Scenario 1: Student completes assignments given in their instructional packets. In this scenario, students will be graded on the expectation of 2 grades per subject, per week.
- Scenario 2: Student completes assignments via the online learning platform assigned by teacher. In this scenario, students will be graded on the expectation of 2 grades per online subject, per week.
- Scenario 3: Student completes assignments using both instructional packets and online learning platform. In this scenario, students will continue to be graded on the expectation of 2 grades per either instructional packet/online learning platform or a combination of both, per subject, per week.
- Each grade given per assignment will carry equal weight.
- Example: $(10$ grades)/10 $=6$-week average
- Grades will be taken from the first week through the fifth week of the 6 -weeks grading period. This means grades will be taken from April $6^{\text {th }}$ through May $7^{\text {th }}$. Students will receive 10 grades for the last 6 weeks grading period.
- Teachers will assign 2 assignments per week during the remaining 5 weeks of school; no assignments will be given the last week of the $6^{\text {th }}$ six-week grading period.
- All grades will be recorded in the Daily Grades of the gradebook
- Any grade that is significant (test/project-like) will be a double daily grade
- All assignments will have a one-week time-frame to complete / turn-in
- There will be an additional week period of grace beyond the initial deadline.
- There will be no final exams this semester.
- The $6^{\text {th }} \mathbf{6 w k}$ average will not negatively impact student averages/GPA if a student attempts to participate and complete the work. The 2020 spring semester average will be determined by the $4^{\text {th }}$ six-weeks grade and the higher of the $5^{\text {th }}$ or $6^{\text {th }}$ six-week grade. *A valid attempt is defined as completion of $70 \%$ of the assigned work for the $6^{\text {th }}$ six-week grading period; this means the student must complete 7 out of 10 assignments.
- Grades will be taken from the first week through the fifth week of the 6 -weeks grading period. This means grades will be taken from April $6^{\text {th }}$ through May $7^{\text {th }}$. Students will receive 10 grades for the last 6 weeks grading period.
- The current local policy regarding determining class rank for SENIORS will be followed.
- Local policy states: For the purpose of determining honors to be conferred during graduation activities, the District shall calculate class rank at the end of the fifth six-week grading period of the senior year. The average of the fourth and fifth six-week grades shall be used as the semester grade for this purpose.

| Example 3 <br> Student did not make a <br> valid attempt on $6^{\text {th }}$ <br> $6 w k s$ | 80 | 40 | Student did not make a valid attempt (did not <br> complete $70 \%$ of assignments) therefore, both <br> six-weeks grades will be counted. <br> $(80+40) / 2=60$ <br> $\left(60+4^{\text {th }} 6 \mathrm{wks}\right.$ grade $) / 2=$ semester grade |
