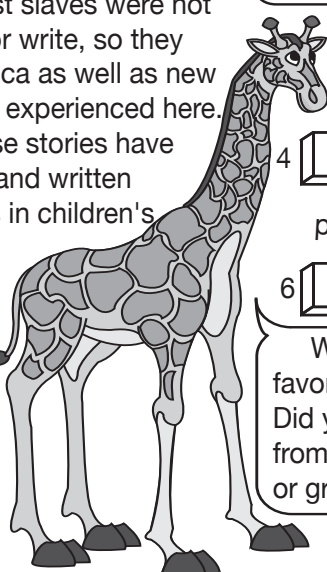


African and American Folktales
