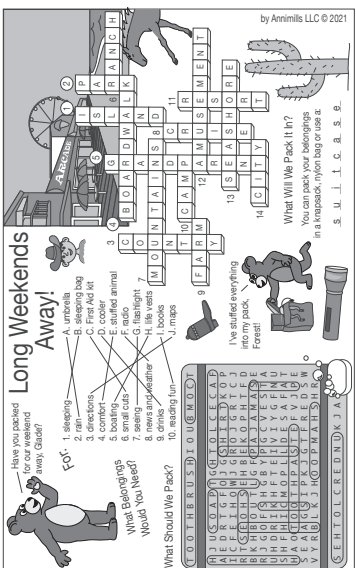
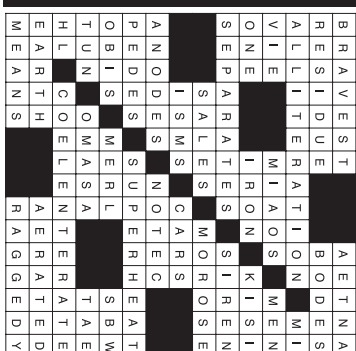

private getaways for just your own family.

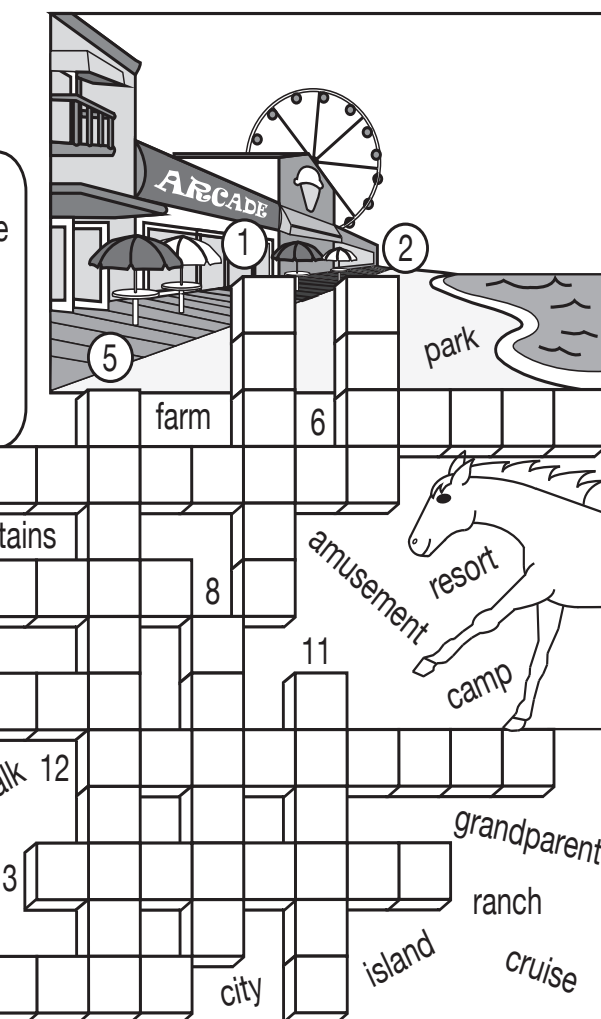
