


Donley County Gin, LLC, has applied to the
Texas Commission on Environmental Quality
(TCEQ) for
renewal of Air Quality Permit Number 21830,
which would authorize continued operation of
a Cotton Gin located at 3900 Highway 287,
Lelia Lake, Donley County, Texas 79240. This

location is provided as a public courtesy and
not part of the application or notice.

and/or related facilities are authorized to emit
the following air contaminants: carbon mon-
oxide, nitrogen oxides, organic compounds,
particulate matter including particulate matter
with diameters of 10 microns or less and 2.5
microns or less and sulfur dioxide.

This application was submitted to the TCEQ on
September 7, 2022. The application will be
available for viewing and
copying at the TCEQ central office, TCEQ Ama-
rillo regional office, and the Donley County
Courthouse Annex, 220 West 4th, Clarendon,
Donley County, Texas beginning the first day of
publication of this notice. The facility's compli-
ance file, if any exists, is available for public
review in the Amarillo regional office of the
TCEQ.

The executive director has determined the
application is administratively complete and
will conduct a technical review of the applica-
tion. In addition to the renewal, this permitting
action includes the incorporation of changes
in emission factors related to this permit. The
reasons for any changes or incorporations, to
the extent they are included in the renewed
permit, may include the enhancement of oper-
ational control at the plant or enforceability of
the permit. The TCEQ may act on this applica-
tion without seeking further public comment
or providing an opportunity for a contested
case hearing. If certain criteria are met.

PUBLIC COMMENT. You may submit public
comments to the Office of the Chief Clerk at
the address below. The TCEQ will consider all
public comments in developing a final decision
on the application and the executive direc-
tor will prepare a response those comments.
Issues such as property values, noise, traffic
safety, and zoning are outside of the TCEQ's
jurisdiction to address in the permit process.
**OPPORTUNITY FOR A CONTESTED CASE HEAR-
ING.** You may request a contested case hear-
ing if you are a
person who may be affected by emissions of
air contaminants from the facility. If request-
ing a contested case hearing, you must submit
the following: (1) your name (or for a group
or association, an official representative),
mailing address, daytime phone number; (2)
applicant's name and permit number; (3) the
statement "[I/we]
request a contested case hearing;" (4) a spec-
ific description of how you would be adversely
affected by the
application and air emissions from the facility
in a way not common to the general public; (5)
the location and
distance of your property relative to the facility;
(6) a description of how you use the property
which may be
Impacted by the facility; and (7) a list of all
disputed issues of fact that you submit during
the comment period. If the request is made by
a group or association, one or more members

who have standing to request a hearing must
be identified by name and physical address.
The interests the group or association seeks to
protect must also be identified. You may
also submit your proposed adjustments to the
application/permit which would satisfy your
concerns.

The deadline to submit a request for a con-
tested case hearing is 15 days after newspa-
per notice is published. If a request is timely
filed, the deadline for requesting a contested
case hearing will be extended to 30 days after
mailing of the response to comments.

If any requests for a contested case hearing
are timely filed, the Executive Director will for-
ward the application and any requests for a
contested case hearing to the Commissioners
for their consideration at a scheduled Commis-
sion meeting. Unless the application is
directly referred to a contested case hearing,
the executive director will mail the response to
comments along with notification of Commis-
sion meeting to everyone who submitted com-
ments or is on the mailing list for this applica-
tion. The Commission may only grant a
request for a contested case hearing on issues
the requester submitted in their timely com-
ments that were not subsequently with-
drawn. If a hearing is granted, the subject of
a hearing will be limited to disputed issues of
fact or mixed questions of fact and law relat-
ing to relevant and material air quality concerns
submitted during the comment period. Issues





nuts to eat during the cold winter months.


Children play soccer, football and other fall sports.


