



The executive director has determined the application is administratively complete and will conduct a technical review of the application. In addition to the renewal, this permitting action includes the incorporation of changes in emission factors related to this permit. The reasons for any changes or incorporations, to the extent they are included in the renewed

permit, may include the enhancement of operational control at the plant or enforceability of the permit. The TCEO may act on this application without seeking further public comment or providing an opportunity for a contested case hearing If certain criteria are met.


