Led by a couple of event victories and several other top placings, the Clarendon College men's rodeo team won its home event this past weekend.

"We had a lot of people step up and do good for us, and that's what it takes to win in our region," Clarendon College rodeo coach Bret Franks said. "I think the Southwest Region is the toughest in college rodeo, so any time you can win in this region, it's a big deal.

"Winning at home makes it even better."

Sam Petersen of Helena, Montana, won the bareback riding title, scoring 82 points to win the first round and 77 points to finish second in the championship round. His tworide cumulative score of 159 points was good enough to claim the overall title. Petersen is now in second place in the Southwest Region's bareback riding standings.

Fellow bareback rider Weston Patterson finished fifth in the first round and also placed in fourth in steer wrestling. Responsibility important part of free society

Freedom and the personal responsibility required for the effective functioning of a republican form of government are powerful one-two punches. Anarchy reigns when feeble leadership encourages freedom to be uncoupled from responsibility. Tyranny triumphs. It is impossible to consider personal responsibility absent a perspective of freedom that guides behavior individually and collectively. In the United States, constitutional provision and liberty simultaneously govern the agency of free will. Freedom. Such governance is inextricably linked to enlightenment thinking, glued in place by Judeo-Christian values embedded in our national ethos and commonly expressed in the Texas Panhandle.

In 21st-century America, moral absolutes are fading. On many college campuses, anyone holding any view that appears to be a moral absolute is branded and denigrated as phobic, thick-skulled, uninformed, regressive and generally stupid. Truthfulness, honesty, hard work, regard for others, a love of family, community and country, are launching pads for exercising personal responsibility. Not stupid. Thoughtfully informed moral frameworks create community. Thomas Jefferson wrote, "Can the liberties of a nation be sure when we removed their only firm basis, a conviction in the minds of the people, that these liberties are a gift of God?" Jefferson's idea applies at the macro level nationally and the micro level of a relationship between two people in a family, many people in a community or region and the citizenry of a state. Liberty is the bookend of a collection of lives bounded on one end by freedom and the other by responsibility.

The Bill of Rights Institute appropriately claims that virtues are required to sustain citizenship in a free society. James Madison, in Federalist No. 55, wrote, "There is a degree of depravity in mankind which requires a certain degree of circumspection and distrust, so there are other qualities in human nature which justify a certain portion of esteem and confidence." It is the burden of individual citizens to understand how community virtue and the exercise of personal freedom interact.

These precepts are properly embedded in American thought. John Locke recognized the interdependence of freedom and responsibility by championing the idea that people are "free, equal and independent." In his Second Treatise on Civil Government, he observed the workings of a free society and explained, "A state also of equality, wherein all the power and jurisdiction is reciprocal, no one having more than another..." Moreover, sequences of personal responsibility form hierarchies leading to structured, productive relationships beneficial to individuals and communities. A "success sequence" that represents thoughtful accountability yields freedom. A time-honored series of life events in contemporary society: graduating from high school (at least), getting a full-time job and marrying before having kids (in that order). George Will called the success sequence "insurance against poverty." Poverty may steal personal responsibility and freedom. Or, possibly, poverty is present when responsibility and freedom are absent. Or, most, unfortunately, a dastardly combination of

There is a war on personal responsibility. Interest and identity groups endeavor to absolve individuals of responsibility and instead selectively and seductively pass out praise and condemnation based on group membership rather than individual action. Walter Williams said, "Personal responsibility has taken a back seat in our increasingly immoral and litigious society." The tribe of indebted college graduates and non-graduates is an identity group. No matter how attractive (seductive) the forgiveness of college indebtedness appears, pen-stroke absolution of personal responsibility is a 21st-century tragedy. Hard work and rewards for performance, self-control and thoughtful accountability - personally owned, not group-condoned should be the coin of the realm.

Some organizations associated with rural life impact people in rural Texas, especially the Panhandle. In 1917 the Smith-Hughes Act was committed to the advancement of agricultural education. It focused on a better quality of life for people in rural agricultural settings and farm families, then eventually, the wider world. The Future Farmers of America (FFA) espouse and trumpet values that are part of the culture of rural communities. Likewise, 4-H has similar commitments. Both organizations make a positive difference in the lives of others, respecting the rights of all and their property, being courteous, honest and fair with others and communicating appropriately. In addition, 4-H believes in developing young people who are empowered, confident, hard-working, determined, responsible and compassionate - seeing a world beyond themselves, so they have the life-long skills to succeed in college and their careers. Such values instill a sense of personal responsibility permeating the youth and their families.

These efforts are contagious and relevant in urban and suburban environs in the 21st-century too. The focus on personal responsibility, intellectual and moral development and accountability for one's actions are attractive everywhere. For others, this thinking is anathema. Freedom and personal responsibility are a dynamic duo transcending geography and culture while addressing the bedrock of the human condition. Universities that embrace such thinking will likely be effective.

Japanese-Americans loyal in WWII

One might think it only natural that both Federal and local officials should have concerns about the loyalty of Japanese-Americans at the beginning of World War II. Whether intentional or not, would the members of this culture group tend to support the land where they now lived or the land of their cultural heritage? These concerns showed themselves at the beginning of the war by the great forced migrations of Japanese-Americans from the West Coast and other key areas to the more interior and remote areas of the nation. Some of these families were moved to places in

In the United States there were two categories of Japanese-American. There were the "Iessi" who were first generation Japanese who had come directly from Japan, and there were the "Nisei" who had been born here as second and third generation Japanese. The Iessi were particularly under observation.

In Texas, as well as throughout the United States, the Japanese-Americans made great efforts to demonstrate their loyalty to the land in which they were living. However, a watchful eye was always upon them. Consider the following examples.

Japanese who ran large businesses were particularly vulnerable during this time. To show their loyalty, Kichimatsu Kishi, an Orange County rice farmer who had organized the Orange Petroleum Company, and Kaname Susujki, the president of the company, offered themselves to the police for arrest. The police readily accepted the offer:

Port Arthur, December 8 – [AP] – Two wealthy Japanese Nationals from Orange were held in jail Monday and guards were placed over records of the oil company they operated. . . .

Their families were among a dozen other Japanese put under close surveil-

Deputy sheriffs quoted one of the Japanese as saying, "They must be crazy over there. I'd rather be in jail here than free there.

(From The Austin Statesman) *On the day following the Pearl* Harbor attack, Fred Chiutaro Maizumi registered at the San Antonio police station, saying, "Japan can never hope to win this war. It would be like the foolish monkey attacking the elephant."

In McAllen, Henry Kawahata, a young and successful farmer was quoted in the McAllen Daily Press as saying, "I'm ready to fight for the United States against Japan. We're for the United States 100 per cent." A few days later, Henry took advantage of the opportunity to address the Rotary Club to which he

He walked to the speaker's table and addressed the club. "While I am of Japanese extraction, I am a born American. All my sisters were born in America. In this war with Japan, I – and *my family – salute the Stars and Stripes* and pledge allegiance to the United States of America."

He then snapped to attention and saluted the flag. (From the San Antonio

Dr. Sadakazu Furagochi, arrested in El Paso, at the beginning of the war, offered his services in a humanitarian way. It is said that he could have sought release but declined to do so after noting the generally poor health of the other internees and the shortage of doctors. Dr. Furagochi spent the war tending to the physical and mental needs of his


fellow prisoners, and for his service he received a special commendation from the Japanese government in 1960.

In 1936 Reo Kataoka became a gardener for Jimmy Elkins of Houston. Immediately after Pearl Harbor Day, arrested him. Jimmy then stepped forward, explaining that Rao used the light and gun only against armadillos and other pests destructive to Elkins'

Although composed mostly of Japanese-Americans from the west coast, many Niesis from Texas were also included. The 442nd participated successfully in heavy fighting in several campaigns in Italy and then in France and Belgium including the Battle of the Bulge. They received 52 Distinguished Service Crosses, 1 Distinguished Service Medal, 560 Silver Stars, 22 Legion of Merit Medals, 15 Soldier's Medals and 4,000 Bronze Stars. They also received 9,486 Purple Hearts. But although having served valiantly, they had deep concerns about coming home and being relegated again to the status of second-class citizens. Actually, their exemplary service was a major factor in convincing the U. S. Congress to vote to admit Hawaii as the 50th state of the Union (after two previous failed attempts). The example of the 442nd is also credited with having a major influence in the abolishment of laws restricting property ownership and other obstacles to full citizenship of Japanese-Americans.





Davis carried the ball once for 21 yards and had 79 yards receiving and Smith carried once for five yards and caught two Howard passes for 79 yards. Brown had three carries for 23 yards and Josiah Hearn carried three times for 12 yards and one TD.

The Bronco defense was solid once again with several players racking up tackles. They did a great job of containing the Indians behind the 50-yard line for all of the first quarter and several minutes of the second.

The Colt defense never gave up and stayed solid throughout the game. Haynes and Robinson each finished with four tackles and Herbert had three. Rice and Klay Wilkins grabbed two tackles apiece and Butler, Moore, and Ronan Howard posted one tackle each.

"We lost a close one Thursday night," coach Boston Hudson said. "I feel like our kids are getting better every week and have come a long way from last year. Looking forward to getting better this week and hope to get a win this Thursday."


