## Poets and Poetry!



So, you want to learn about poetry.  
Read the clues below to fill in the  
puzzle with some "keys" to poetry:

- single line of poetry
- small part of a word that makes **diff - i - cult** words  
easier to break up and say
- to say one syllable of a  
word **LOUD**-er than others
- a pair of lines, every time having  
the same length and rhyme
- two or more lines put together  
that usually follow the same  
meter and rhyme
- words that **SOUND** like  
their meanings: **buzz**,  
**hiss**, **crack**, **crunch**
- string of words that all have the **Same Starting Sound**
- a little bounce within a poem that sets a funky beat
- organization of each line of poetry, takes into account  
the number of syllables and which syllable is stressed
- when two or more words have similar ending sounds,

Read about these favorite poets, then match each poet to one of his well-known books:

- Jack Prelutsky** - first **Children's Poet Laureate**; traveled and talked about poetry for children
- Dr. Seuss** - invented the word "**Nerd**" in one his books; sold hundreds of millions of books worldwide
- Shel Silverstein** - said he started writing because he wasn't good at baseball and girls didn't like  
him; he never studied other poetry and therefore developed his own style
- Roald Dahl** - spoke English, Norwegian and Swahili
- Lee Bennett Hopkins** - used poetry to teach topics like geography, mathematics and science
- Thanhha Lai** - used prose poetry to tell her story of escaping from Vietnam
- Kwame Alexander** - poet and an educator; his sports books written using verse
