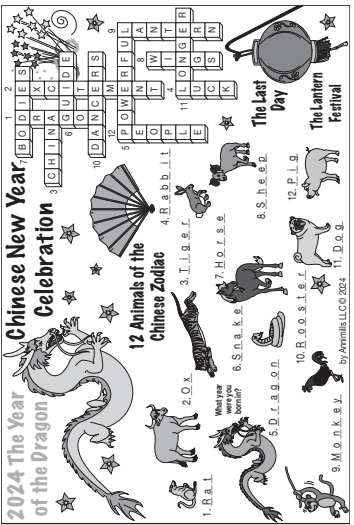
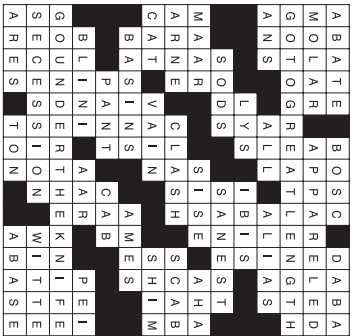

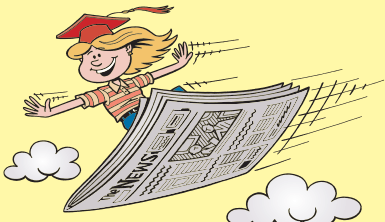

The Chinese New Year celebration starts this year on Saturday, February 10th and will last 15 days, ending with the Lantern Festival on Saturday, February 24th. The Chinese Calendar has a 12-year cycle with each year represented by an animal. This year is the Year of the Dragon, the most powerful animal. The New Year is a time of family. In many large cities there are lots of fun family events: dinners, parades, concerts, races, zoo visits and fireworks.
