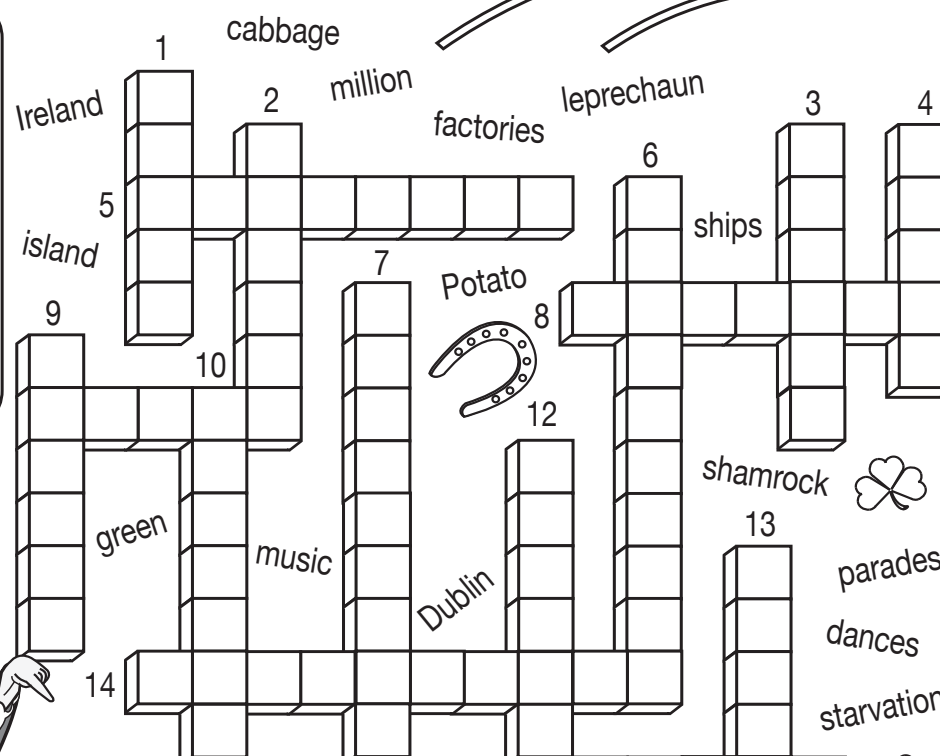
Celebrating St. Patrick's Day
