Kaleb Bolin

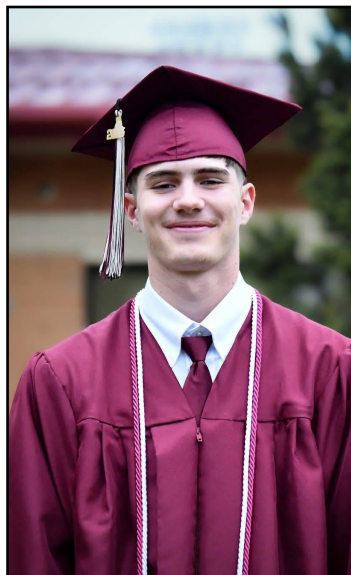

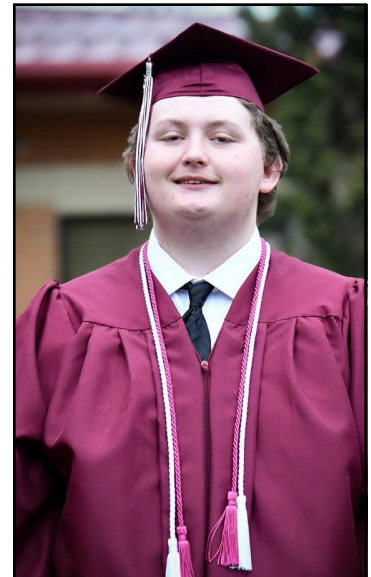
Riley Rose Jantz

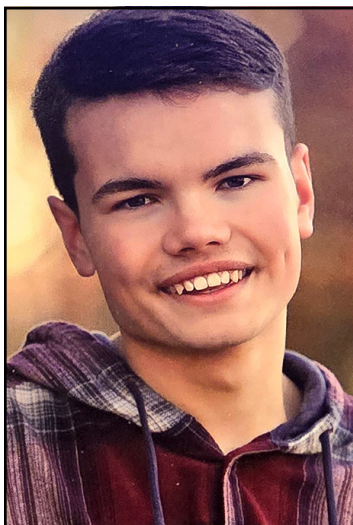

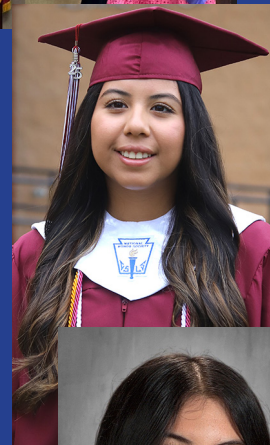

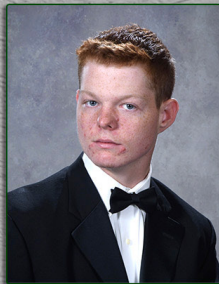
