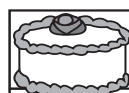
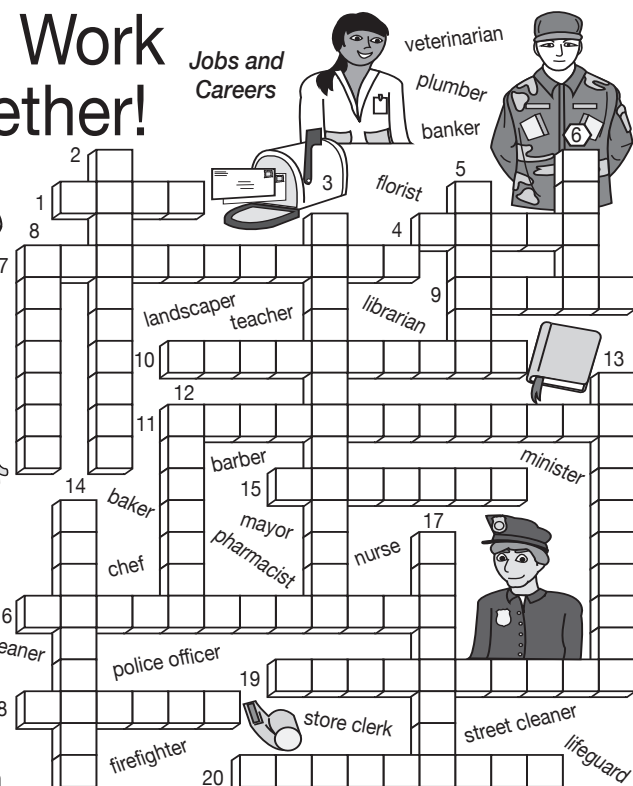
I'll bet you can think of lots

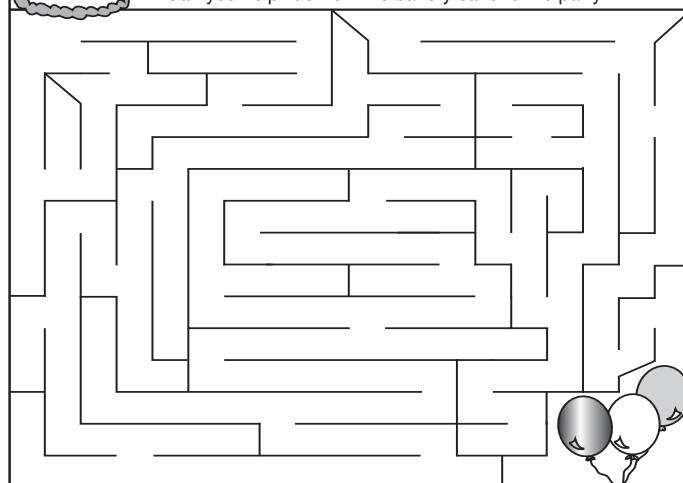
